The five pieces of advice have been summarised below.

- 1) **Choose your online friends wisely.** You don't have to accept friends requests or chat with people you don't know just because they ask you to.
- 2) Be really careful about sharing photos online. If you would not want your teacher to see a picture don't post it online.
- **3)** Be really careful about sharing personal information: You should not share information like your address, your phone number or the school you go to with strangers.
- **4) Keep your information private.** Most apps and social media have privacy settings. Use them and get help using them.
- 5) If anybody tries to put you under pressure to say or do something you are not happy about say no, stop the conversation and tell an appropriate adult.


